

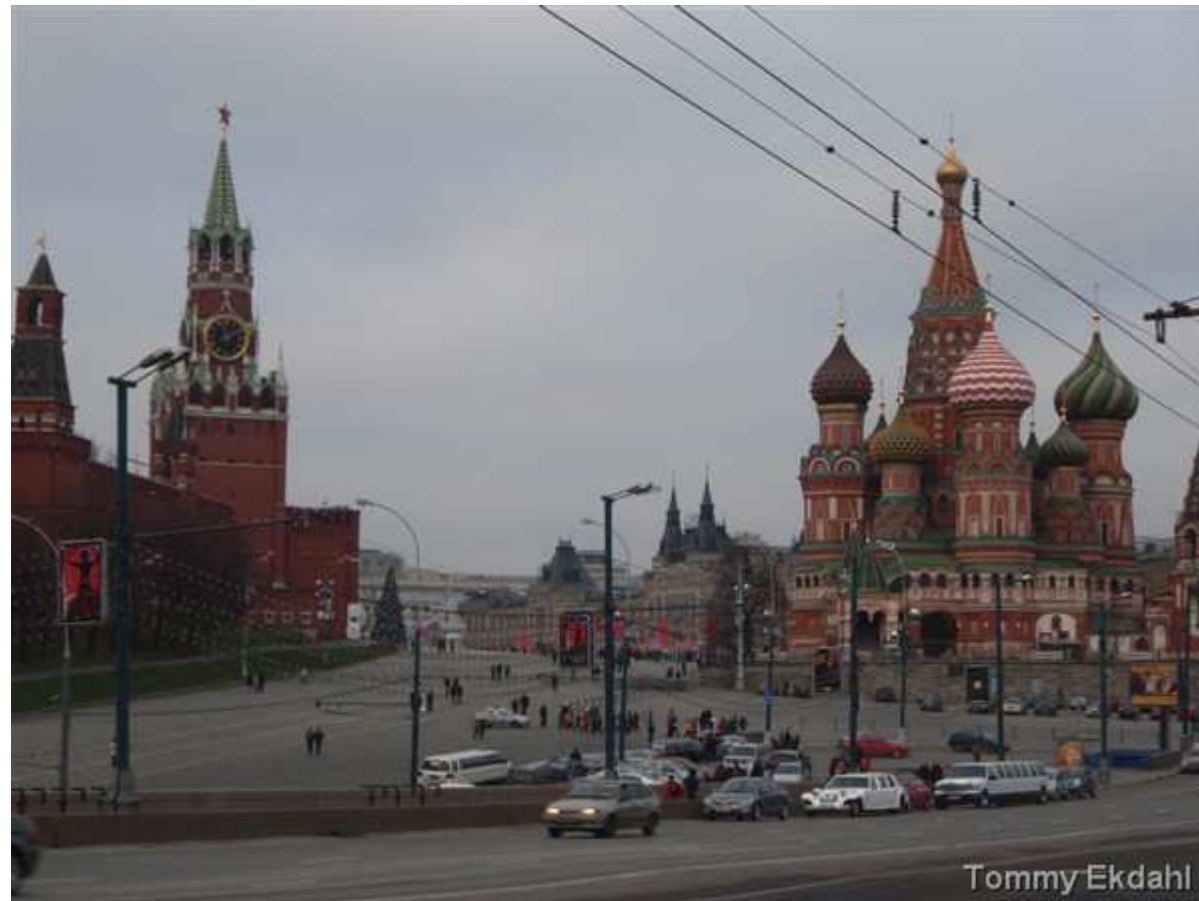
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Moscow 2008

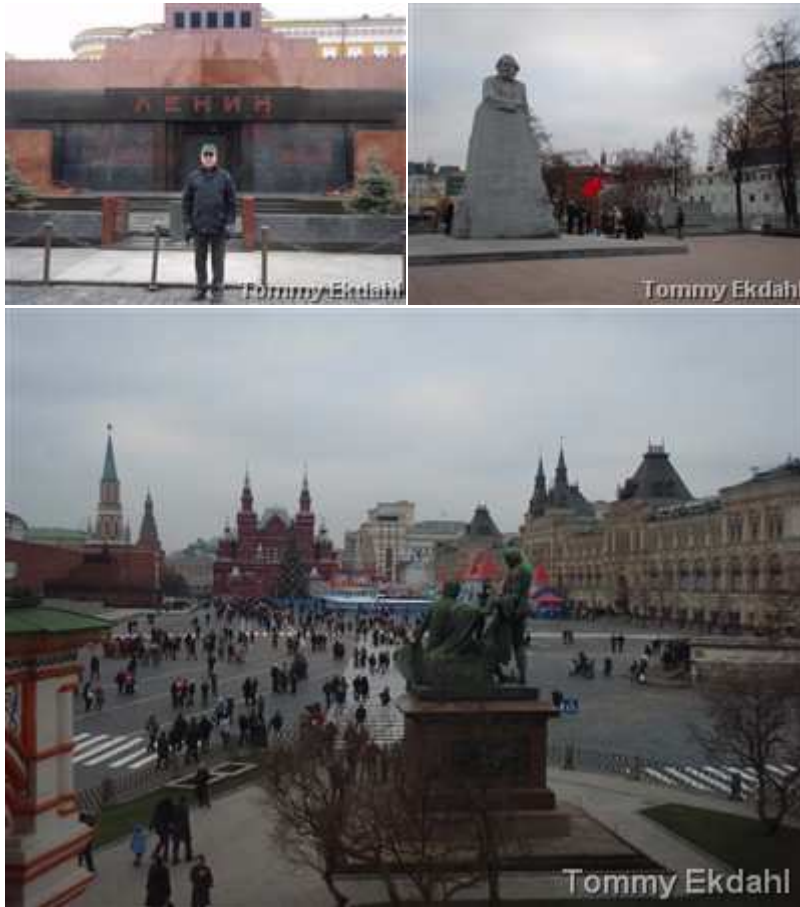


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Around Red Square

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Temple of Christ the Savoir

We visited this temple during a Sunday time and it was very impressive. The temple is brand new which is very interesting.

Some of its history is:

By 1931 the head of the Soviet state and of the Communist Party, Joseph Stalin destroying the temple on the banks of the Moscow River and replacing it with a new "temple" - a colossal statue of himself. The temple was blown up and replaced by a public heated swimming pool in use for several decades.

By 1995 the foundations of the restored temple were laid and construction proceeded quickly.
